Immediately after the storms, Prevent Child Abuse (PCA) Louisiana worked to meet the needs of displaced families by offering new services and bringing existing services to them, first at the shelters and then into the trailer communities.

The Board of Directors and staff of PCA Louisiana also undertook the large task of revising our organization’s strategic plan. Months of frank discussions and hard work have led to the creation of a new roadmap that will guide our organization for the next five years.

We hope you will take a few moments to review our activities from the last two years. It has been a trying time, but we have seen the goodness of Louisiana’s citizens through the tragedy. Our hope for the new year, and the years to come, is to make Louisiana a safer, healthier and brighter place for our children.

PROGRAMS

Prevent Child Abuse Louisiana promotes effective prevention programs and training in local communities through First Steps, Welcoming Baby, KIDLINE, Nurturing the Families of Louisiana™, BEST DADS, Circle of Parents and the Training Institute.

First Steps – a hospital-based program that offers new parents extra support and information on infant care.

First Steps volunteers provide parenting information, non-judgmental support and referrals to local resources shortly after the birth of an infant. The First Steps “Great Beginnings with Your Baby” booklet is given to postpartum mothers during the initial hospital visit. The volunteer will go over the key points of the booklet and offer emotional support by listening to the mother’s concerns.



During the First Steps visit, the volunteer will make arrangements to contact the mother in a few weeks to see how she and the baby are doing. The volunteer will make a series of follow-up calls over the next few months in order to continue to provide support and additional information.

Alternative First Steps – A program for teen mothers that provides information on infancy and early childhood development and allows the mothers to share concerns and questions in a group setting.

Welcoming Baby – A home-visitation program that provides parenting information, guidance, resources and support to military families at Ft. Polk

How do First Steps and Welcoming Baby help prevent child abuse and neglect?

Protective Factors strengthened: Concrete support in times of need; social connections in the community; and knowledge of development

Risk Factors addressed: lack of knowledge about child development; unrealistic expectations; social isolation; lack of access to community resources

In Fiscal Years 2004-05 & 2005-06, First Steps volunteers saw 9,200 new mothers at 20 sites statewide, and 2,472 mothers at Ft. Polk were served through Welcoming Baby.

KIDLINE, 1-800-CHILDREN (1-800-244-5373) – a statewide, toll-free telephone program offering crisis intervention, support, parenting information and referrals to community resources. The service is available from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. every day.

KIDLINE offers a safe, confidential atmosphere for individuals who may be hesitant to seek face-to-face counseling. Staff and trained volunteers answer a variety of calls from stressed parents, victims and survivors of abuse, families in crisis, professionals working with families, third-parties wanting to report abuse and individuals wanting information to improve their parenting skills.

How does KIDLINE help prevent child abuse and neglect?

The variety of calls that come in to KIDLINE allow volunteers to address all protective factors and several risk factors.

In Fiscal Years 2004-05 & 2005-06, 1,795 calls were taken and almost 4,700 hours were logged by trained volunteers on KIDLINE.

Protective Factors strengthened: Concrete support in times of need; parental resilience to stress; social connections in the community; knowledge of parenting and child development; and parental nurturing and attachment

Risk Factors addressed: stress; cultural and social myths about children; lack of knowledge about child development; unrealistic expectations and unmet needs of parents; social isolation; and the cycle of abuse or neglect

Nurturing the Families of Louisiana™ – a structured, weekly program designed to help parents and children reduce dysfunction and build healthy, positive interactions

Nurturing the Families of Louisiana™ volunteers act as facilitators for parent and children groups. The parents and children are placed in separate groups and given activities tailored to their needs. Topics covered during the adult sessions include anger management, self-esteem, positive communication, child discipline and child development.

PROGRAMS, *continued*

The program lasts 16 weeks. Each block of sessions has the capacity to serve eight to 10 parents and 12 to 15 children.

Nurturing the Families of Louisiana™ can be held in fathers-only or mothers-only groups upon request.

Best Dads – a 13-week nurturing program tailored specifically for fathers

How do Nurturing the Families™ of Louisiana and Best Dads help prevent child abuse and neglect?

Protective Factors strengthened: parental nurturing and attachment; knowledge of parenting and child development; parental resilience to stress; social connections in the community; and concrete support in times of need

Risk Factors addressed: stress; anger; unrealistic expectations and unmet needs of parents; inability to cope with feelings; low self-esteem; depression; lack of knowledge about child development; lack of knowledge about different methods of discipline; the cycle of abuse or neglect; and domestic violence

In Fiscal Years 2004-05 & 2005-06, 4 Nurturing the Families of Louisiana sites served 165 families, and 6 Best Dads sites throughout Louisiana served 472 fathers.

Circle of Parents – a program where parents meet weekly to share their concerns and gain support from each other.

Circle of Parents groups provide places for parents to build their own sense of competence and power. They do this by building relationships and connecting with other parents who share common experiences, successes and challenges.

Through weekly group meetings co-led by parents and professionals, participants:

- gain a sense of belonging and relief as they learn that their family dynamics and their

child's behavior are typical, and that the challenges a parent faces can be overcome

- become resources to each other inside and outside of the group by sharing coping strategies and parenting skills from parents who have been there
- advocate for themselves and other parents as they give and receive help while recognizing that seeking help is a sign of strength, not weakness

Circle of Parents was brought to Louisiana to offer parents displaced by the storms a new source of support.

How does Circle of Parents help prevent child abuse and neglect?

Protective Factors strengthened: concrete support in times of need; parental resilience to stress; and social connections in the community

Risk factors addressed: parents' social isolation; unmet needs; stress; anger; cultural and social myths about children; lack of knowledge about child development; and lack of knowledge about different methods of discipline

In Fiscal Year 2005-06, 106 facilitators were trained to lead Circle of Parents groups.

PCA Louisiana provides training and technical assistance in the development and implementation of parenting and child abuse prevention programs for professionals, agencies, volunteers and the community.

"Kids Are Worth It!" Conference on Child Abuse and Neglect – PCA Louisiana's annual statewide conference attracts social workers, child protection workers, law enforcement officials, physicians, attorneys, day care workers, teachers and others who work with children. The topics discussed in the plenary and break-out sessions increase attendees' knowledge base of child abuse prevention and treatment programs.

Mandatory Reporter Training – PCA Louisiana staff train teachers, guidance counselors, doctors, day care workers, Scout leaders and others who are required by law to report suspected abuse or neglect. The training includes a review of the signs and symptoms of abuse and neglect, as well as the procedure for reporting a suspected case of child maltreatment.

Parenting Series – short or mini-workshop presentations that PCA Louisiana provides for parenting groups, corporations, neighborhood programs, etc. Topics are stress prevention, positive communication and positive discipline.

How does the Training Institute help prevent child abuse and neglect?

Protective Factors strengthened: parental resilience to stress; knowledge about parenting; knowledge about child development; and social connections in the community

Risk factors addressed: stress; anger; cultural and social myths about children; lack of knowledge about child development; and lack of knowledge about different methods of discipline

In Fiscal Years 2004-05 & 2005-06, 10,906 mandatory reporters were trained and 1,242 people took part in the Positive Parenting Series by PCA Louisiana staff, trained volunteers and partner organizations.

Champion: an ardent defender or supporter of a cause or another person.

Each year, Prevent Child Abuse Louisiana honors those among us who go above and beyond the call of duty. Those who, in whatever capacity they can, serve as an ardent defender and supporter of Louisiana's youth. They are our Champions for Children.

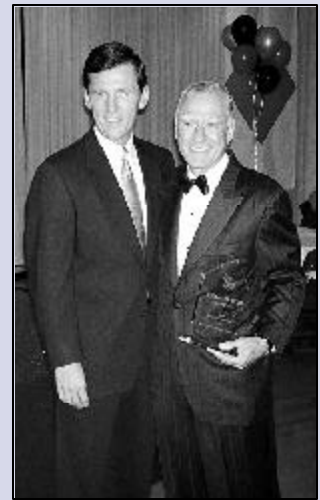

ADVOCACY

Prevent Child Abuse Louisiana advocates for child abuse prevention at the state and local level, collaborating with other advocates to ensure that children's issues are a priority.

In 2005, the YouWho Coalition and the Louisiana Alliance for Children and Families announced their merger into the Louisiana Partnership for Children and Families. The Partnership is a statewide network of organizations serving children, youth and families focused on public policy and best practices for service delivery. Having incubated the YouWho Coalition during its first two years of existence and served in a leadership role in the Coalition, PCA Louisiana supported this merger and continues to play a vital role within the new group.

PCA Louisiana staff and volunteers advance our advocacy efforts in the following ways.

- Partnering with the Louisiana Association of Nonprofit Organizations (LANO) for advocacy and public policy trainings
- Advocating before the Louisiana Legislature and other public officials for policies and programs that prevent child abuse
- Working with public and private youth-serving agencies to increase collaboration and services to benefit children and families
- Educating and informing our grassroots network about child welfare issues

COMMUNICATIONS/PUBLIC EDUCATION

Prevent Child Abuse Louisiana uses public education and communications efforts to inform the general public about our work to stop the horrors of child abuse and neglect before they begin.

Child Abuse Prevention Month – During April, Child Abuse Prevention Month, our Blue Ribbon and Blue Bow campaigns call attention to the prevalence of child abuse and the importance of prevention. PCA Louisiana staff plan and participate in community activities throughout the month to raise awareness of the issue and our prevention efforts.

Safe Haven – The Louisiana Department of Social Services, Office of Community Services (OCS) contracted with PCA Louisiana in Fiscal Year 2004-05 to help raise awareness of the state's Safe Haven law. The law allows for a parent to anonymously surrender an infant, no more than 30 days old and not a victim of abuse, at a designated emergency care facility. Those facilities are any licensed hospital, medical center, public health unit, police station, fire station, EMS provider, child advocacy center or crisis pregnancy center.

Over 150 community organizations, other non-profit agencies and individuals signed Safe Haven partnership agreements, consenting to help raise awareness of the law. During the campaign, two more newborns were relinquished, making a total of four infants to be surrendered using the Safe Haven law.

Community Outreach – PCA Louisiana staff members and volunteers speak to many community, civic and governmental groups throughout the year. The organization also maintains a comprehensive website, www.pcal.org, provides organizational updates via emails, as well as producing brochures, news releases, postcards and letters to the editor to keep our constituents aware of our current issues and prevention activities.

In Fiscal Years 2004-05 & 2005-06, PCA Louisiana staff, Board members and other volunteers appeared on 57 television and radio news programs, were featured in 197 newspaper articles, maintained 381 speaking engagements and reached 24,657 Louisiana citizens with our message of child abuse prevention.

Media – PCA Louisiana provides the media and the public with statistics and other information on child abuse, parenting issues and victim services. Staff members and volunteers appear on radio and television news programs to promote our prevention activities throughout the year.

DEVELOPMENT

PCA Louisiana strengthens its resources by building long-term financial security, maintaining a qualified and well-trained Board of Directors and building and maintaining a leadership position statewide in child welfare.

Night of the Child – PCA Louisiana's premier fundraiser, *Night of the Child* events were held in Monroe, New Orleans, Baton Rouge, Lafayette and Lake Charles in Fiscal Year 2005, raising \$268,475 for the organization. While each event has a different feel, the branding of

Night of the Child has become synonymous with our organization in each region.

Because of the hurricanes, the only *Night of the Child* events held in Fiscal Year 2006 were in Monroe and Baton Rouge. PCA Louisiana staff and volunteers look forward to the events returning to all regions next year.

Other Events – Golf Tournament: Sponsored by the Capell/Frayard Professional Money Management Group of UBS Financial Services, Inc., the 5th annual PCA Louisiana Golf Tournament was held in October 2004 at Le Triomphe Golf and Country Club in Broussard (Acadiana region). Players had the chance to win a car, courtesy of Giles Automotive, at several designated hole-in-one greens, and winning team members received gift certificates to the Le Triomphe pro shop. A drawing was also held for \$5,000.

Better Than Ezra Concert: Thanks to a contact by PCA Louisiana Board member Ebie Strauss, the band Better Than Ezra agreed to donate a portion of the proceeds from two concerts they performed at the House of Blues in New Orleans in December 2004.

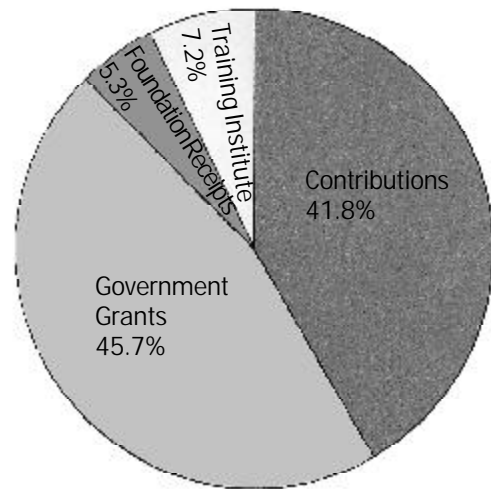

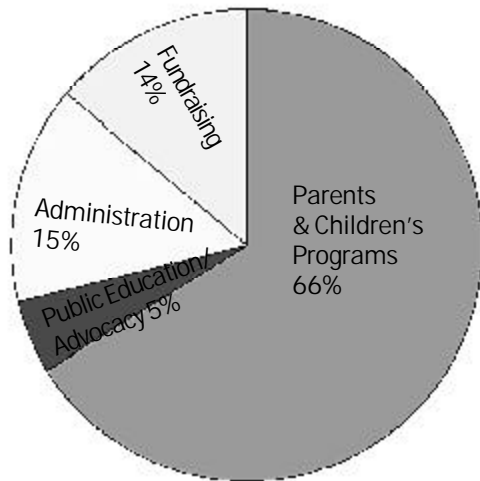

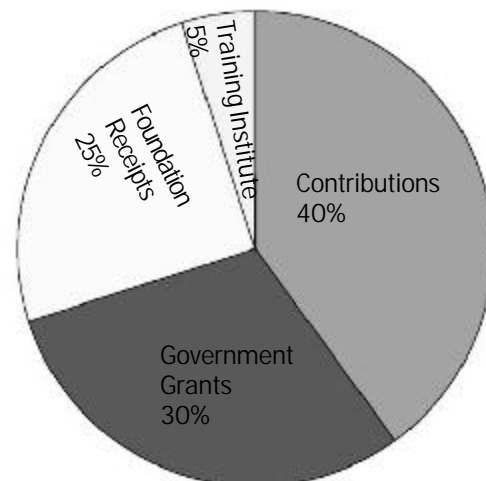
